Concerns	Those respondents not in support of the proposals, and some who were unsure, were concerned that the Sixth Form Colleges Trust might replicate the failings of school multi-academy trusts that they had experienced directly or knew about. The central concerns were that the MAT might seek to alter staff terms and conditions, dictate pedagogy from the centre and divert valuable funds away from the classroom. Others questioned how effective collaboration could be, given the Colleges are located in different counties, and a few staff expressed concerns about the possibility of working across the two sites.
Our Response	The driver to cocreate the Sixth Form Colleges Trust is to <u>preserve and</u> <u>enhance</u> both The Sixth Form College, Colchester and Long Road Sixth Form College for many generations to come. Hence our very clear commitment to maintain our sixth form college terms and conditions to ensure we can continue to recruit and retain our talented staff. We have no plans for a costly central team, quite the opposite, with colleagues combining roles to keep costs down. Pedagogy, we are adamant, is for subject specialists to determine.

	The geographical distance between the two colleges limits significantly the potential to share on site staffing, instead technology (the use of Microsoft Teams as an example) enables us to collaborate easily, sharing ideas in a time-efficient, greener way. Planning together, we will be able to schedule joint student events/visits/projects, thereby increasing opportunities, reducing costs and maximising impact.
Next Steps	The Sixth Form Colleges Trust is created on the 1st of September 2024.
